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#### Of 100 custody records reviewed:



**53%** of detainees were recorded as having mental health issues;



19% of detainees were recorded as ever having attempted suicide or self-harm with 12% who admitted they had thoughts of suicide or self-harm;



**45%** of detainees were recorded as having consumed alcohol in the last 24 hours and **12%** declared they had an alcohol dependency;



22% of detainees required the services of an appropriate adult; and



19% of detainees were recorded as having consumed drugs in the last 24 hours and 15% confirmed they had a drug dependency;



5% of detainees required the services of an interpreter.



7% of detainees were recorded as having a disability: 18% of detainees had a difficulty with reading or writing and 25% of detainees were recorded as having another vulnerability issue;
