Thank you for your recent Freedom of Information request submitted via email to Criminal Justice Inspection Northern Ireland (CJI) on I September 2022.

Our understanding of the information you have requested is in two parts and is as follows:

Part I:

- Copies of minutes of all meetings from 1 February 2022 onwards that the Chief Inspector, Jacqui Durkin has held with the Director General of the Prison Service, Ronnie Armour and/or the Justice Minister Naomi Long in relation to any of the following:
 - C|INI's 2022 review into CSUs;
 - the Prison Service's efforts to implement change in CSUs off the back of this review; and
 - o any further inspections/investigations that CJINI has done in CSUs since the review was published.

Part 2:

- Copies of all correspondence from I February 2022 onwards that the Chief Inspector Jacqui Durkin has shared with the Director General of the Prison Service Ronnie Armour, and or the Justice Minister Naomi Long in relation to any of the following:
 - C|INI's review into CSUs;
 - the Prison Service's efforts to implement change in CSUs off the back of this review; and
 - any further inspections/investigations that CJINI has done since the review was published.

To enable us to progress both Parts I and 2 of your request and provide the information that you request, we have interpreted the abbreviation 'CSUs' to mean the Care and Supervision Units in the Northern Ireland Prison Service. If this is not correct, please let us know.

For the purposes of response we have interpreted your timeframe for the information you requested, stated as 'I February 2022 onwards' to be from I February 2022 up to up the date of our reply to your Fol request. If this is not correct, please let us know.

We have also interpreted your term 'correspondence the Chief Inspector shared with the Director General of the Prison Service' to mean correspondence sent or received by the Chief Inspector. Again, if our interpretation is not correct, please let us know.

I can confirm the following information is being released in response to your request.

Part I

A)

The Chief Inspector of Criminal Justice in Northern Ireland, Jacqui Durkin met with the Director General of the Northern Ireland Prison Service (NIPS), Ronnie Armour on 10 May 2022 to discuss progress made against the recommendations made to the NIPS in the CJI review into the operation of Care and Supervision Units (CSUs) published on I February 2022.

A second meeting between Chief Inspector of Criminal Justice in Northern Ireland and the Director General of the NIPS took place on 9 August 2022 to provide an update on progress made in respect of recommendations relating to health care.

CJI does not hold a record of a minute of either meeting, therefore no copies can be provided in response to your enquiry.

- B) Since the publication of CJI's review into the operation of CSUs by the NIPS on I February 2022, the Chief Inspector has not met with the Minister of Justice, Naomi Long MLA to discuss the review or the NIPS's efforts to implement change in the CSUs.
- C)
 CJI has not undertaken any further inspections in CSUs operated by the NIPS since the review was published. The Chief Inspector included a follow-up review of the operation of CSUs in the NIPS in the 2022-23 Inspection programme which was published alongside the CJI 2022-23 Business Plan on 23 May 2022. The Annual Business Plan and Inspection Programme for 2022-23 can be viewed or downloaded by following the link or from the Corporate Documents area of the CJI website. When this work has concluded, the findings of follow-up review will be published on the CJI website.
- D)
 CJI does not undertake investigations as part of its statutory remit therefore no investigations have been undertaken by the Inspectorate in relation to CSUs.

 As CJI does not undertake investigations as part of its statutory remit no correspondence in relation to CSUs is being released.
- D) From I February 2022 to date, the Chief Inspector has not shared correspondence with the Minister of Justice Naomi Long MLA in relation to:
 - CJI's review into CSUs;
 - the [NI] Prison Service's efforts to implement change in CSUs off the back of this review; or
 - any further inspections/investigations that CJI has done since the review was published.

Information which may lead to the identification of individuals has been redacted in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) except where it refers to holders of senior public appointments or public office where the identity of the individual is already publicly known.

Good afternoon Ronnie

Further to our e mails below and our meeting on 10 May, thank you again for the information provided, it is clear progress is being made by you and your team on the CSU Review recommendations.

You asked for comments on your draft CSU Operational Framework (the draft) and I hope the following observations are helpful:

 While this is an operational framework, we think the draft would benefit from the inclusion of more background and an overview of the pertinent Human Rights obligations, UNCAT, OPCAT, European Prison Rules etc. The glossary does not sufficiently cover this and directly link to why meeting the standards and monitoring them is important. This is where we think the Human Rights Commission would be of assistance and have accessible information that could be of help to you and readers? While the standard minimum rules are in the glossary it doesn't actually connect these to what that means in terms of operational practice (maybe the intention is to link further training and guidance to the draft).

- A clear explanation of what exactly the framework is and what it includes such as legislative requirements, policy, strategy and action plans, SOP, guidance etc (maybe the purpose and core objectives section could be expanded to include this?).
- It would also be helpful if there was clear messages about whether the aspiration is to demonstrate that the minimum rules have been met or aspire to more if this is feasible.
- The piece about engaging with individuals and supporting change is missing under performance measures. It
 would have been good to see some measures in here about working to reduce the time people spent in
 CSUs, less repeat admissions, numbers of people successfully resettled on landings with appropriate
 support, people receive the right support at the right time. I think under measures as well CSU exit survey is
 listed but this is a tool rather than for example 90% of people said they felt cared for or felt safe.
- The outcomes rehearse Prisons 25/25 rather than some of the things mentioned above. The governance and
 assurance activity could provide more detail on who is provided with assurance and when and why this is
 important. As you know, I had concerns that the most recent CJI report (some 3+ years old) was cited as the
 only source of assurance, this framework is an opportunity to explain how effective governance and
 assurance will operate.
- The role of the CSU outlines who will reside there rather than how NIPS aspire to support them, however we see the principles get into that a bit.
- You might want to reflect on page 9 and if embedded in the draft is the right place for it? The operational
 framework should stand alone and while subject to review this section will soon become dated with
 implementation.
- During our meeting we spoke about the qualifications around, 'but voluntary' and 'but the person has the
 right to decline' which of course they do but what action does that trigger to break that cycle and attempts
 to develop engagement? The Expectations are noted as a principle on their own rather than principles such
 as people are placed in CSUs as a last resort and for the shortest time possible and have access to an
 equitable range of purposeful activities.

I hope this is helpful in developing your draft. Regards Jacqui
